

2020 CONGRESSIONAL SCORECARD

The Eating Disorders Coalition for Research, Policy & Action wants voters to know where their Members of Congress stand when it comes to supporting eating disorders initiatives on Capitol Hill. This scorecard reflects how each Member of Congress supported policy issues most important to the eating disorders cause in the 116th Congress (2019-2020).



The Facts on Eating Disorders

- 28.8 million Americans, or 9% of the U.S. population, will be affected by an eating disorder in their lifetime.¹
- There is 1 death every 52 minutes as a direct result from an eating disorder, equating to 10,200 deaths per year.²
- Eating disorders include anorexia nervosa, bulimia nervosa, binge eating disorder, avoidant/restrictive food intake disorder, other specified feeding or eating disorder, unspecified feeding or eating disorder, pica, and rumination disorder.³
- Eating disorders affect people of all races, however, people of color with eating disorders are half as likely to be diagnosed or to receive treatment.⁴
- Eating disorders also affect people of all genders, sexual identities and orientations, socioeconomic statuses, body sizes and ages.⁵
- The yearly economic cost of eating disorders in the U.S. is estimated to be \$64.7 billion.⁶
 - o Cost for individuals and families: \$23.5 billion
 - o Cost for government: \$17.7 billion
 - o Cost for employers: \$16.3 billion
 - o Cost for society: \$7.1 billion
- Eating disorders lead to 53,918 emergency room visits annually, costing \$29.3 million, and 23,560 inpatient hospitalizations costing \$209.7 million.⁷
- Servicemembers and their families are affected at higher rates than the civilian population.⁸
- COVID-19 has significantly affected persons with eating disorders, with recent research showing increases in eating disorder behaviors including restrictive behaviors in people with anorexia nervosa, and binge eating behaviors in people with binge eating disorder and bulimia nervosa.⁹

How Members Will Be Scored

INDICATORS

Members will be given a ✓ for each letter they have signed, legislation they have co-sponsored, or legislation that they have voted for that directly relates to eating disorders. A ✓* will be given for "original" co-sponsors of a piece of legislation. It is important to note that the legislative efforts listed on this scorecard reflect a combined effort from the eating disorders community, and not solely EDC-led initiatives.

GRADING

Members will be assigned a letter grade depending on the number of items they have supported. **Additionally, being a "Lead" or an "Original Co-sponsor" on a bill or a letter was given extra weight.** Leading an item is counted as the equivalent of supporting four items, while being an original co-sponsor was counted as the equivalent of supporting two items.

B = 3

C = 2

D = 1

KEY

1 = Special election winner or appointee. Due to those Members not having served a full term in Congress, they will be graded as "N/A."

2 = Leadership. Party leaders as well as relevant committee leadership have been graded as "N/A" as members of leadership and committee of jurisdiction leadership often do not co-sponsor bills, sign letters, or vote on items due to their position.

3 = Chair or ranking member of a committee or subcommittee that works on eating disorders legislation. As chair and ranking members often do not co-sponsor legislation before their committee, those specific items have been graded as "N/A."

Lead = The lead or co-lead sponsor of a bill or letter.

Lead* = A lead or co-lead sponsor of a bill, who led that initiative on the Appropriations Committee.

116th Congress Items

(1) Nutrition CARE Act ([H.R. 3711/S. 2907](#))

Nutrition CARE Act (H.R. 3711/S. 2907): The bipartisan Nutrition Counseling Aiding Recovery for Eating Disorders (CARE) Act permits the 3% of seniors and 4.5% of persons with disabilities affected by an eating disorder to receive outpatient Medical Nutrition Therapy (dietitian services) under Medicare Part B, at the same level as other conditions such as diabetes and renal disease.

(2) SERVE Act ([H.R. 2767/S. 2673](#))

The bipartisan Supporting Eating Disorders Recovery Through Vital Expansion Act (SERVE) Act expands the Department of Defense's military health care system, called TRICARE, to allow military family members over age 20 to access eating disorders care, ensure servicemembers and their families have access to comprehensive eating disorders treatment nationwide, and train Commanding Officers and supervisory personnel about the early warning signs of all mental illnesses. Congress has taken significant steps to advance the SERVE Act. The FY 2021 Senate National Defense Authorization Act (NDAA) included report language based on the SERVE Act encouraging the Department of Defense (DoD) to enact the provisions, and the FY 2021 House of Representatives NDAA included report language for DoD to provide a report to Congress on the cost and feasibility of expanding care for military families.

As of the release of this publication, the FY 2021 NDAA has not been passed into law.

(3) SERVE Amendment #608 to House of Representatives FY2021 NDAA

The bipartisan House of Representative leads submitted an amendment based on the SERVE Act to include the

SERVE Act within the final House FY 2021 NDAA. The amendment was not successful due to Congressional budgetary concerns.

(4) Eating Disorders Prevention in Schools Act (EDPSA) ([H.R. 6703](#))

The bipartisan EDPSA integrates eating disorders prevention and encourages screening for eating disorders within Local School Wellness Policies through the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA), which are used to guide school districts in the creation of supportive school nutrition environments, prevent disordered eating, eating disorders, and improve health outcomes of children. This legislation is Section IV of the LIVE Well Act (H.R. 2625).

(5) Long-Term Investment in Education for Wellness (LIVE Well) Act ([H.R. 2625](#))

The bipartisan LIVE Well Act integrates eating disorders prevention and encourages screening for eating disorders within community-based nutrition education and obesity prevention programs and Local School Wellness Policies through the United States Department of Agriculture (USDA) to prevent disordered eating, eating disorders and improve health outcomes for children and adolescents in schools and community-based programs.

(6) House CDC FY 2020 & FY 2021 Eating Disorders Surveillance through Federal Appropriations

This initiative, including letters ([FY20 House](#) and [FY21 House](#)), urges the CDC to assist States in collecting data on disordered eating behaviors in adolescents and adults by including questions on disordered eating behaviors within the Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance

System. These provisions were passed within Further Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2020 (P.L. 116-94) for FY 2020 and can be found in [House Report 116-62](#).

As of the release of this publication, the Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education, and Related Agencies (LHHS) Appropriations Act, 2021, has not been passed into law, however, was included within the [House Report 116-450](#) and passed the House of Representatives in the Defense, Commerce, Justice, Science, Energy and Water Development, Financial Services and General Government, Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, Transportation, Housing, and Urban Development Appropriations Act of 2021 (H.R. 7617). The Senate has not brought forth for consideration their LHHS Appropriations Act for FY 2021.

(7) House and Senate National Institutes of Health (NIH) FY 2021 Federal Appropriations for Increased Eating Disorders Research

This bipartisan federal appropriations request, including a bipartisan House [letter](#) and a combined Senate eating disorder-issue bipartisan [letter](#), urges the NIH to increase funding for eating disorders research through multiple institutes and centers (such as the National Institute of Mental Health, National Institute of Diabetes and Digestive and Kidney Diseases, National Institute on Minority Health and Health Disparities, and National Institute on Drug Abuse), and include research on related psychosocial issues, health disparities and food security, environmental factors, the interplay of metabolic process, and maternal health. NIH will provide a report to Congress on their progress.

As of the release of this publication, the Departments of Labor, Health and Human Services, and Education, and Related Agencies (LHHS) Appropriations Act, 2021, has not been passed into law, however, was included within the [House Report 116-450](#) and passed the House of Representatives in the Defense, Commerce, Justice, Science, Energy and Water

Development, Financial Services and General Government, Labor, Health and Human Services, Education, Transportation, Housing, and Urban Development Appropriations Act of 2021 (H.R. 7617). The Senate has not brought forth for consideration their LHHS Appropriations Act for FY 2021.

(8) Senate Health Resources and Services Administration Eating Disorders Education and Training (from Anna Westin Act) in FY 2021 Federal Appropriations

This initiative, including a combined Senate eating disorder-issue bipartisan [letter](#), urges for continued funding for the Primary Care Training and Enhancement programs at the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) and requests funding for the Education and Training on Eating Disorders program authorized by the Anna Westin Act provisions of the 21st Century Cures Act.

As of the release of this publication, the Senate has not brought forth for consideration their LHHS Appropriations Act for FY 2021.

(9) Senate DoD FY 2020 and FY 2021 Peer-Reviewed Medical Research Program Eating Disorders Research

This bipartisan initiative requested that eating disorders be included as eligible for research funding under the DoD Peer Reviewed Medical Research Program (PRMRP). Funding through PRMRP offers an important opportunity to study diseases like eating disorders that are not well-understood, have few treatment options, and for which military service confers a higher risk. These provisions were passed within the Consolidated Appropriations Act of 2020 ([P.L. 116-93](#)) for FY 2020.

As of the release of this publication, the Senate has not

brought forth for consideration their LHHS Appropriations Act for FY 2021.

(10) House and Senate Military (TRICARE) Tele-mental Health Coverage During COVID-19

The bipartisan [House](#) and [Senate](#) letters urge the DoD to expand tele-mental health services at all levels of outpatient care during the COVID-19 national pandemic, including coverage for Outpatient, Intensive Outpatient Programs (IOP) and Partial Hospitalization Programs (PHP), to be equal to what is provided under Medicare.

As of the release of this publication, the DoD's Defense Health Agency expanded TRICARE's tele-mental health coverage through the length of the pandemic to include Outpatient and IOP, however, it continues to exclude PHP.

(11) COBRA Subsidies during COVID-19: Health Care Protection Act ([H.R. 6810](#))

This bipartisan legislation would provide subsidies to COBRA eligible individuals for six months and includes a special ACA open enrollment period for anyone not enrolled in health insurance to provide another pathway for Americans to gain and/or maintain health coverage during COVID-19. As of the release of this publication, COBRA subsidies were included within the House of Representative's HEROES Act (H.R. 6800) with 100% coverage of COBRA subsidies, however, it was not passed into law.

(12) Evaluating Disparities and Outcomes of Telehealth (EDOT) During the COVID-19 Emergency Act of 2020 ([H.R. 7078](#))

The EDOT Act of 2020 requires the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) to collect data on fraud, privacy/security issues, utilization, and expenditures and savings regarding telehealth services. Data would be broken down by site of care, type of technology, and demographic factors including age, gender, race, disability status, region and income to gain a better understanding of telehealth disparities.

As of the release of this publication, provisions from H.R. 7078 were included within the Senate HEALS Act (S. 1624), however, has not passed into law.

(13) Health Care at Home Act ([H.R. 6644/S. 3741](#))

This bipartisan legislation requires Commercial (ERISA plans) and ACA health insurance plans to cover telehealth services at the same rate for services permitted in-person during COVID-19.

(14) Tele-Mental Health Improvement Act ([S. 3792](#))

This bipartisan legislation requires Commercial health insurance plans to cover tele-mental health services at the same rate for services permitted in-person. Additionally, the bill includes protections for Americans by preventing payers from placing barriers to tele-mental health care, requires plans to tell enrollees how to access care, and requires HHS to report to Congress on the impact of tele-mental health parity versus in-person care.

Congressional Champions
